Focus On.... HCA Family Fun Day 2022

I hope you all enjoyed the Fun Day this year, we think the five-hour event from 1pm to 6pm was ideal and manageable with the number of HCA and volunteers we had available.

This year we had more rides, with soft plays, trampolines, bouncy castles, waltzers, hook-a-ducks and a bucking bronco. There were a few no shows and last-minute cancellations but even so still plenty for everyone, I think.

The event was funded by the HCA along with generous cash donations from local businesses and individuals. Other local businesses and members of our community donated vehicles, equipment, raffle and tombola prizes, a real team effort all round and on behalf of the HCA and the community a big thank you.

I would also like to mention the team of volunteers who helped me organise the event, in particular Gail Brown, Chris Keith-Nelson, and Gemma Seedhouse. Their tireless efforts over the past 6 months were rewarded by such a great day and we are very fortunately to have such a committed team. To the members of the HCA and community volunteers who helped set up on the day and manned the car parks, the access gates, sold raffle tickets, tombola tickets, manned the bronco, picked up litter, helped those who needed assistance.... A huge thank you, we couldn't have done it without you. Also, thanks to Dave Edkins for taking photographs of the event, these will be uploaded to the website.

This year we were able to use the large field behind Coronation Road as a car park. This significantly improved safety and security at the event, eliminating the need for people to cross the road on foot and directing people to the access gate on the 'Black Path'. This was made possible by the kind support of Mark, the farmer who works the field. The field is used to grow grass, which is fed to his livestock, so keeping it free from rubbish/dog mess is extremely important to him. There was very little rubbish on the day, so thank you to those who parked there for keeping it tidy. In return can I please ask the community to respect the field and the farmer's crop. It is not a public footpath, nor a place for motorbikes. If we can do our bit, then hopefully we can have access again for many years to come.

I would like to apologise to the small number that arrived with dogs (one stall holder and 2 visitors) and had to be turned away. I should have made this restriction clear on the posters and advertising. The 'no dog' policy is enforced by Hurley King's due to the impact that dog mess has on the playing surfaces, next year I will be clearer, sooner.

Over the course of the year, we will be focussing on those who support our activities, our small way of saying 'thank you'. I encourage the community to support local businesses where possible please.
